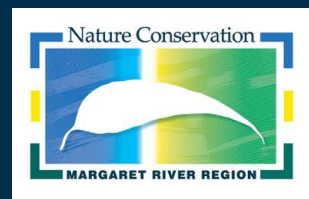




ARUM LILY BLITZ

Undertaking your own arum lily spraying?



If you plan to undertake arum lily spraying yourself we can help by providing free herbicide and instructions on how to spray.

The herbicide chlorsulfuron is highly effective at killing arum lily plants and should be applied when the plant is actively growing between July and October. The ideal window of time is when about 50-70% of the flowers are present.

Roundup (glyphosphate) is ineffective at killing arum lilies.
